Take Master Plan to County for General Plan Amendment

If a "plan" demonstrates coordinated agreement, does that open the Federal cookie jar?

Task force would need to have authorized representation so that plan has real buy-in from jurisdictions

To get "buy-in", you need something <u>specific</u>
Master Plan
