The Pacific Coast Joint Venture, Southern Implementation Area (Sonoma County) committee is pleased to submit the following project proposal for fiscal year 1992 matching funds and fiscal year 1993 funding package.

PROJECT NAME

Laguna de Santa Rosa Wetlands Enhancement Project (Phase One)

STATE/COUNTY

Sonoma County, California

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Sixth District

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Laguna de Santa Rosa is a 7000 acre floodway connected to the Russian River at Mirabel, and extends some 18 miles south to Rohnert Park and Cotati. It is formed by the Santa Rosa Plains on the east, predominantly valley oak grasslands with vernal pools, and on the west by historic coniferous and redwood forest. The heart of the floodway grades from permanent marsh and riparian forest, to seasonal marsh and vernal pools.

The Laguna de Santa Rosa is a major wetland complex that historically provided significant waterfowl production. It has been drained, farmed, irrigated, and otherwise managed resulting in the reduction of waterfowl and wetland species numbers and value. The City of Santa Rosa and subregional wastewater system are presently focusing on this area for program mitigations that include the redevelopment of historic features including ponds, permanent marshes, and the termination of irrigation on upland areas for greater waterfowl production and holding capacity.

The project site is located north of Occidental Road on the Western edge of the Laguna de Santa Rosa basin, and is owned by the California Department of Fish and Game. It is bisected by a channelized portion of the Laguna which was built and is owned by the Sonoma County Water Agency. The project intends to augment wetland habitat by intermittently breaching the existing channel and restoring historic braided stream contours. The project should not alter present flood control storage capacity.

The area habitat tends towards both seasonal and perennial fresh water marsh and riparian woodlands. Enhancement of this habitat will increase the biodiversity within this section of the Laguna basin, affecting wildlife which include the following species:
